



The County Attorney and/or the Chief Investigator of the Gonzales County Attorney's Office is responsible for investigating complaints of misconduct against the members of this agency.

You may obtain a Personnel Complaint form below

Complaints against **TCOLE** employees must meet the requirements of section 614.022 and 614.023 of the Texas Government Code.

614.022 Complaint To Be In Writing and Signed by Complainant to be considered by the head of a state agency or by the head of a fire department or local law enforcement agency, the Complaint must be:

- (1) In writing, and
- (2) Signed by the person making the Complaint

614.023 Copy Of Complaint to be Given to Officer or Employee

- (a) A copy of a signed Complaint against a law enforcement officer of this state or a firefighter, detention officer, county jailer, or peace officer appointed or employed by a political subdivision of this state shall be given to the officer within a reasonable time after the complaint is filed.
- (b) Disciplinary action may not be taken against the officer or employee unless a copy of the signed Complaint is given to the officer or employee.
- (c) In addition to the requirement of Subsection (b), the officer or employee may not be indefinitely suspended or terminated from employment based on the subject matter of the Complaint unless:
 - (1) the Complaint is investigated; and
 - (2) there is evidence to prove the allegation of misconduct

If these allegations determine that the employee acted improperly, disciplinary action will be taken. Because this is a serious allegation, with serious consequences for the employee, all formal Complaints need to be signed, sworn to and notarized.

Please follow the instructions below to ensure the complaint is received and resolve in the most expeditious manner possible.

Instructions

1. Please print all information at the top of page one.
2. Read, but do NOT sign the section related to Perjury in the middle of page one unless you are in the presence of a Notary Public. This form must be notarized. A Notary Public will be available at the County Attorney's Office when you return your complaint.
3. At the bottom of page one, begin writing your complaint and continue writing all that is necessary, utilizing as many pages as necessary.
4. Do NOT sign any page unless you are in the presence of a Notary Public. This form must be notarized. A Notary Public will be available at the County Attorney's Office when you return your complaint.

Tips for writing / filing the Complaint

1. Tell your story in a chronological order.
2. Be detailed and specific. (For example, if your Complaint is that the officer was rude, write exactly what the officer said, when he said it, and how he said it.)
3. Provide any and all witness names and contact information as well as any documentation/proof or your allegation.
4. Please feel free to type the narrative of your Complaint if you would like.

Upon completion of writing your Complaint you may turn it in at any time. The County Attorney or his/her designee will determine how the Complaint will be investigated. You will be notified by the County Attorney or the Chief Investigator assigned to the Complaint.

TEXAS PENAL CODE, SECTION 37.02, PERJURY

- (A) A person commits an offense if, with intent to deceive and with knowledge of the statement's meaning:
- (1) he makes a false statement under oath or swears to the truth of a false statement previously made and the statement is required or authorized by law to be made under oath; or
 - (2) he makes a false unsworn declaration under Chapter 132, Civil Practice and Remedies Code.
- (B) An offense under this Section is a **Class A Misdemeanor**.
According to Texas Penal Code, Section 12.21, punishment of a Class A Misdemeanor has been defined as: A fine of not more than **\$4,000.00**; confinement in jail for a term not to exceed **one year**; or both such fine and confinement.

I have read Section 37.02 of the Texas Penal Code as set out above, and I am aware of the penalty set out therein for perjury.
